Welcome to 2022! Although we were still amid a pandemic last year, we had our best year to date! What does that mean? Thanks to supporters like yourself, we served more Veteran family members/caregivers than ever before! We held the first Mental Health and Wellness Restorative Weekend in March of last year in Kansas City. During that RW we had our first male caregiver attend. That does not mean there are not male caregivers, that means they have an even tougher time identifying in their role. At COH, we support ALL genders, all eras.... well, what I am getting at is we do not discriminate. We know caregivers come in all different forms and we want you to reach out to us!

This past year, we changed our business model up a bit in that we went to where the caregivers are at. We knew from past years we always had a lot of applicants from Texas and Florida. So, we held two restorative weekends in Texas and went to Florida as well. We also partnered with other organizations to bring our expertise to them. Wounded Warrior Project and Paralyzed Veterans of South Florida partnered with us to serve their caregivers. We received funding from the Elizabeth Dole Foundation, Veterans United Foundation, and The Coalition to Salute America's Heroes to continue to host our restorative weekends. We went from our average of two per year to six in 2021! Going to where the caregiver is also helps us spread donor dollars well. Know at COH, your dollar is always on our minds, and we make sure we are not spending frivolously. From double occupancy at our restorative weekends to limiting the amount of airline tickets we must buy, to getting food donated to self-care items as well.

We held a Bingo fundraiser virtually and had a lot of fun doing! We also used Krispy Crème gift cards as a fundraiser for people to send them to the caregiver in their life. Who doesn't love a good, hot, melt in your mouth donut?! Our 3rd annual 5K for suicide prevention was held in June with an emotional story behind it. Check that in the pages that follow. In October we were welcomed at Belvoir Winery in Liberty, MO where we hosted our first ever Poker tournament fundraiser. It may have been small, but it was mighty! We are looking forward to doing those again this year!

Thanks to GEHA Health and their employees, we packed 500 care packages for Veterans and their family caregivers which we handed out at the Kansas City VA Medical Center. Many Veterans are used to getting things for their service but when I went up to a family member to hand them one, they had this to say, "I'm not the Veteran, he is". When I said, no this is for you many had tears in their eyes. If you live in the Kansas City metro area this should tell you how much further, we must go to make sure Veteran family caregivers are seen for what they are doing behind the scenes.

For me, it is very important that I continue to advocate for our caregivers which means educating our communities. I presented virtually with several Veteran's Affairs Hospitals, the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Service Administration, local mental health organizations, and others.

As we move into the next year our work is not over. Without you, our caregivers, donors, partners, and supporters none of the above would be possible. We have several new partnerships that we look to do good work with and a new program that supports children of wounded/ill Veterans. Check out the rest of our report! Veterans cannot be well supported without their family. Families cannot be well supported unless our communities step up. Caregivers on the Homefront will continue to step up and offer the support they deserve.

This year we partnered with Reboot Recover to provide Trauma Reboot to our caregivers. Caregivers devoted 12 weeks to their own mental health and wellness. Co-facilitated by Natasha Swayze, therapist and Program Director, and Shawn Moore, ED, co-facilitated the course. We were honored to have Evan and Jenny Owens, founders of Reboot Recovery, speak at our first graduation. Caregivers give so much of themselves, oftentimes not getting the time to work on their own trauma. We laughed and cried but in the end we started to recognize who we are and how we can overcome our own traumas. What a testament to the strength and grit of military and veteran caregivers everywhere! Just look at those smiles!

#### RESTORATIVE WEEKEND PROGRAM



Our restorative weekends focus on educational workshops, therapeutic activities, peer support, and partnerships with community partners.

These two-day retreats are hosted in Kansas City, MO and utilize a holistic approach to prioritize and empower the caregiver.

In 2021 we began hosting our restorative weekends in different cities across the country and expanded our reach to more caregivers. Holding six Restorative Weekends in five different states.

"I was able to open up about my current caregiver situation and touch on a lot of issues I had to deal with as a child, as it seems my life is going full circle. This week opened up some hidden issues and feelings that needed airing out, knowing my strengths also helped me in dealing with all of it. I found out that I am not the only person who has these emotions and problems-that right there was the best support I could have ever asked for. Thank you for making this weekend happen."



"This weekend taught me that I cannot be there for everyone at 100 percent if I don't start being there for myself. I need to take time for my physical and mental health and be a better person from the inside to be a better person for those around me. I need to give myself love instead of only giving everyone around me love."

On June 19, 2021 Caregivers on the Homefront hosted its third Annual Will You Walk with Me 5k to start the conversation about suicide prevention. We have been supported every year by Murphy's Marchers, this years group 39 members strong, lead by Diane Braun, mother of SGT Charles "Murphy" Wells. We were honored to have Diane as our guest speaker. She spoke of the importance of access to mental health. Diane's son, Murphy, died by suicide on February 13, 2019. With the pain of Murphy's death still attached deep in her voice, she advocates for him. Sharing her story, touching our hearts, and destigmatizing mental health. This is the epitome of the Will You Walk with Me 5K. Let's Start a Conversation! Paying it forward even more, Murphy's sister, Liz Wells, now sits on our board.

This past November, First Lady Dr. Jill Biden announced her Joining Forces initiative will partner with the Hidden Helpers Coalition to address the serious concerns found in the Elizabeth Dole Foundation's commissioned study of children from military and veteran caregiving homes. The study revealed children of military and veteran caregivers struggle with increased levels of stress, stigmatization, and significant disruption in their lives.

To show our support and commitment, we introduced our newest program, Homefront Hangout. Teens, who have experienced the challenges associated with living in a home with a wounded veteran, are paired with Tweens, who are currently navigating these challenges, to increase Tweens' sense of hope, strengthen support networks, and provide Tweens with a firm foundation of resiliency.
